

# Car seats save lives.

BC law requires all children, newborn to 9 years, be in a child restraint

## Did you know...?

- Babies need to stay rear-facing in their car seats until they are at least 9kg (20 pounds) and 1 year old

Parents are encouraged to keep children rear-facing beyond one year to the car seat manufacturer's rear-facing maximum weight limit

## Did you know...?

- Children over 18kg (40 pounds) and under 145cm (4 ft 9 in) tall need to be in a booster seat until they reach their 9th birthday
