




## ... use a *Diskus*®

Suggested age: 4 years and up

The *Diskus*<sup>®</sup> contains a dry powder medication. The *Diskus*<sup>®</sup> is breath activated, breathing in deeply and steadily pulls the medication out.







- 2. Hold *Diskus*® with the mouthpiece towards you. Slide the lever away from you as far as it will go, until it clicks. The *Diskus*® is now ready to use. Every time the lever is pushed back a dose is made available for inhaling. This is indicated by the dose counter.
- 3. Breathe out fully, away from the Diskus®.
- **4. Seal lips around the mouthpiece**, holding the inhaler either horizontally or upright.



- **5. Breathe in deeply and steadily** through your mouth. You may or may not taste or feel any medication when breathing in, this is common.
- 6. Hold breath for 10 seconds or as long as possible.
- 7. Remove the *Diskus*<sup>®</sup> from your mouth before breathing out slowly.
- 8. If more than one dose has been prescribed, repeat the steps 2 to 7.



- **9.** To close *Diskus*®, put your thumb on the thumb grip and slide it back toward you as far as it will go. When you close the *Diskus*®, it clicks shut. The lever automatically returns to its original position and is reset.
- **10. Rinse mouth and gargle with water** after using corticosteroids, including combination puffers. If possible, do not swallow the water.
- Always check the expiry date of medications.
- Read the instructions that come with the *Diskus*®.

## Special instructions

- Keep the *Diskus*® dry. Moisture in the breath or in the air will interfere with the delivery of the medication. Dose counting
- The number in the dose counter window tells you how many doses you have left. Shaking the *Diskus*® does not tell you if it is full or empty! The dose is actually lost when you shake or drop the *Diskus*® after it is loaded. If this happens, you should load a new dose for your child to inhale.

## Cleaning instructions

- · Wipe the mouthpiece with a dry tissue or cloth.
- · Never wash the device with water.
