Your Blood Test at BC Children's Hospital



Soon, you will get a blood test. This book shows you what will happen.



Doctors sometimes ask for blood tests. In a blood test, a lab assistant takes a little bit of your blood. This blood tells your health-care team what is happening in your body.

A blood test helps doctors to understand how to help you feel better.



When you come to the hospital, go to the Oak Street Lobby.

Take the elevator up to the 2nd floor.

Turn left outside of the elevators.

Then, turn left again.

You will see a sign that says **Laboratory Blood Collections.** Enter here.








Please check in with the clerk. They will ask you some questions.

Then, you can wait in the waiting room.

You can bring a tablet, book, or toy to use while you wait.





When it is your turn, a lab assistant will call your name. You and your grown-up can follow them into the room.

You can sit on the chair by yourself. Or, you can sit on your grown-up's lap.






Your chair will have a table to rest your arm on.






If you have come with numbing cream on, it is time to take it off. Who would you like to take it off?





It is time for your blood test. You have some choices.



Do you want to watch the blood test?

Or, do you want to look at something else?

Some people like to know everything that is happening. Some people like the lab assistant to be quiet.

What would you like?



The lab assistant will tie a big rubber band around your arm. Some people say this feels tight.





The lab assistant will touch your arm with their finger. They are finding the best vein to use.



Then they will wipe your skin to make it clean. Some people say this feels cold.






The lab assistant will slide the butterfly needle under your skin. Some people say they feel a little pinch or a push. Others say it doesn't bother them.

Your job is to keep your arm still.





Once the butterfly needle is in place, it stays there for about 15 seconds.





When the blood test is done, the rubber band comes off and the needle slides out.



The lab assistant will place a cotton pad and a Band-Aid on your arm.



It is good to press on the Band-Aid for 2 minutes.





Your blood test is over. Good job!





Pain Management

There are different ways to feel more comfortable for your blood test.

1. Numbing cream

This cream stays on your skin for 30-60 minutes. It helps you feel the poke less. If you want to use cream, put it on before you come to the lab. **Do you want to use numbing cream?**



2. Buzzy Bee

Buzzy Bee goes on your arm during your blood test. It vibrates. When Buzzy Bee buzzes, you won't feel the poke as much.

Do you want to use Buzzy
Bee? If you do, tell your lab
assistant when you get here.





For parents and caregivers: Helping your child cope with blood work

Before your Lab visit:

- Think about what pain management techniques may work best for your child.
- Bring a familiar toy or comfort item. Some people bring a book, toy, or tablet.
- If your child is an infant, bring a soother or bottle to calm them.
- Encourage your child to drink lots of fluids the day before.
- Talk to your child about their blood test.
 - Tell them why they need it.
 - Be honest. Explain what your child will see, hear and feel. This
 is important, even if you think it may scare your child. Being
 honest helps your child to trust you.
 - Assure your child that you will be there to support them.
 - Invite your child to share their thoughts and fears with you.

At the Lab:

- Please tell the staff how your child copes best.
- Encourage your child.
- Be calm and firm. Do not suggest that the procedure is optional.
 Offer realistic choices, like: "Do you want to watch the poke or the tablet?"

Caring for yourself:

It is natural to feel anxious when your child has a blood test. Think about how you can stay calm. When you are calm, your child is more likely to feel calm too.



For parents and caregivers: About numbing cream


- You can buy numbing cream at most pharmacies. You
 do not need a prescription. Ask your pharmacist how to
 use the cream.
- The most common brands are Emla and Ametop.

About Emla:

- Emla takes 60 minutes to work. Apply Emla one hour before you arrive at the lab.
- You can buy Emla at most pharmacies.

About Ametop:

- Ametop is best if your child has small or tricky veins.
- Ametop takes 30-45 minutes to work.
- You can buy Ametop at BC Children's Pharmacy or at *some* London Drugs locations. There is a list of stores that sell Ametop on the last page.
- If you buy a different brand of cream, ask your pharmacist how long it needs to stay on the skin.
- Ask a health care professional if you have any questions or concerns.

For parents and caregivers: How to apply numbing cream at home

It can be helpful to put the numbing cream on both arms. The lab assistant will choose which arm has the best vein.

 Before you come to the lab, place a large dollop of cream on the inside of the elbow. Try to cover a spot with large looking veins. Do not rub the cream in. It needs to sit on top of the skin to work.



2. If the cream comes with a sticker, use it to cover the cream. Or, you can cover the cream with plastic wrap (Saran wrap).
