

How to prepare for surgery

 Buy salt water (saline) rinses from your local pharmacy before the day of surgery.

What to expect after surgery

Pain

- Your child may have some pain in or around their nose for a few days after the procedure. Tylenol (acetaminophen) and Advil (ibuprofen) should help. Follow the directions on the bottle.
- You can reduce pain and swelling by using an icepack on your child's nose.
- Your child may feel better if they sleep with their head elevated on more than one pillow.

Vomiting

 Your child may vomit for several hours after surgery. Their vomit may look like dark coffee grounds.

- Give your child lots of fluids to drink.
- Your child can return to their normal diet when they feel like it.
- It is normal for your child to have bad breath.

Nose care

- Always wash your hands before and after
- Your child may leave with a small piece of gauze under their nose. The gauze will collect what might drip out. You can remove the gauze the next day, or when the nose stops dripping.
- Your child must not blow their nose for at least 2 weeks. They can gently wipe anything that drips out.
- Your child will need to flush their sinuses with a saltwater rinse. Follow the directions given by their doctor.

Activity

- Your child can go to school when they feel ready. They should not return to gym class or sports yet.
- Your child's doctor will tell you when your child can return to sports and swimming. Your child can expect 2-3 weeks without activity.



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Call the ENT Clinic Nurse or Seek Medical Attention if:

- Your child has a fever of 38.5°C or higher that lasts for more than 24 hours, starting 2 or more days after surgery
- Your child's pain does not get better with pain medicine.
- Your child vomits more than 24 hours after their surgery.
- Your child has a headache that gets worse when they stand.
- Your child has swelling or marking around their eyes.
- Your child has bright red bleeding from their nose.
- Your child's vomit has bright red blood in it.
- You have other worries about your child.

Follow up

- Your child should return to the ENT clinic for a follow-up visit 2 weeks after their surgery.
- After your child's surgery, call your doctor's office to schedule this visit.
