
• Your child can return to their normal activities when they feel ready.

# Call the ENT Clinic Nurse or Seek Medical Attention if:

- Your child has a fever of 38.5°C or higher that lasts for more than 24 hours, starting 2 or more days after surgery
- Your child's pain does not get better with pain medicine.
- Your child cannot eat or drink.
- Your child's swelling gets worse more than 3 days after surgery.
- Your child's cheeks are red.
- You have other worries about your child.

### Follow up

- Your child should return to the ENT clinic for a follow-up visit 8-12 weeks after their surgery.
- After your child's surgery, call your doctor's office to schedule this visit.



#### What to expect after surgery

#### **Hospital stay**

• Your child will need to stay in hospital for 2-3 days after their surgery. Their care team will make sure your child can eat, drink, and swallow.

### Pain and swelling

- Your child may have mild pain for about 1 week after surgery.
- To help with pain, you can give your child Tylenol (Acetaminophen), Advil (Ibuprofen), or both. Follow the directions on the bottle.
- Your child will have some puffiness around their cheeks and mouth. This usually starts to get better after about 3 days.

#### Diet

• Your child can start eating a normal diet when they feel ready. This could take a few days.
