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Eosinophilic Esophagitis

Background

General

 Eosinophilic Esophagitis is a chronic allergic inflammatory condition that affects your esophagus, the tube that connects your mouth and your stomach.

Symptoms

- Symptoms vary, however classically involve food sticking, choking on solid foods, and having a hard time swallowing solid foods
- Other symptoms can involve chest pain, heartburn, vomiting

Risk Factors

- Classic risk factors include: (not required)
 - Male sex
 - Atopy Asthma, Eczema, Environmental Allergies

Diagnosis

• Needs a combination of symptoms AND histopathology, which is obtained from the histopathology (obtained by biopsies obtained through endoscopy)

Treatment

Treatment Options

• Standard treatments, need to be discussed with your health team but classically involve antacids, swallowed steroid, and/or food elimination diets.
